Ten Ways to Build Trust			
1	Make relationships a priority. We are in the people		
	business and relationships are everything.		
2	Show personal regard. Invest time in personally knowing		
	otherstheir hopes, fears, dreams, and what they care		
	deeply about.		
3	Make daily deposits. Relational trust is built on a day-to-		
	day basis.		
4	Be a committed listener. Offer full presence to others.		
5	Keep your promises. When you say you will do		
	something, do it without fail.		
6	Use reflective feedback. The language we use is a signal		
	of trust in the relationship.		
7	Promote thinking rather than advice giving. Asking		
	reflective questions over telling mediates the thinking of		
	the other person.		
8	Articulate expectations and standards. Be clear about		
	what you expect with regard to performance.		
9	Trust others. Presume positive intent by believing they		
	"can do!"		
10	Celebrate successes. Say "thank you" on a regular basis		
	to individuals as well as the collective group.
